#### METHODS FOR CALCULATING LIMITS

- **DIRECT SUBSTITUTION:** If f(A) is defined, then the limit as X approaches A is simply f(A).

### Types of Limits

STUDENTS SHOULD ALSO BE FAMILIAR WITH DIFFERENT TYPES OF LIMITS:

- ONE-SIDED LIMITS: THESE LIMITS CONSIDER THE APPROACH FROM EITHER THE LEFT OR THE RIGHT OF A POINT.
- INFINITE LIMITS: WHEN THE FUNCTION GROWS WITHOUT BOUND AS IT APPROACHES A CERTAIN X-VALUE.
- LIMITS AT INFINITY: THESE LIMITS DESCRIBE THE BEHAVIOR OF FUNCTIONS AS X APPROACHES POSITIVE OR NEGATIVE INFINITY.

### CONTINUITY AND ITS IMPORTANCE

CONTINUITY IS A FUNDAMENTAL CONCEPT THAT DESCRIBES THE BEHAVIOR OF FUNCTIONS AT SPECIFIC POINTS. A FUNCTION IS CONTINUOUS AT A POINT A IF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET:

- THE FUNCTION F(A) IS DEFINED.
- THE LIMIT OF F(X) AS X APPROACHES A EXISTS.
- THE LIMIT OF F(X) AS X APPROACHES A EQUALS F(A).

Understanding continuity is vital because it affects the ability to apply calculus concepts such as differentiation and integration. Functions that are continuous on an interval can be analyzed using the Intermediate Value Theorem, which states that if a function is continuous on [a, b], then it takes on every value between f(a) and f(b).

- f(1) is undefined.

Thus, f(x) is not continuous at x = 1.
