Figurative Language

Hyperbole is an intentional exaggeration used for emphasis or humor. It is not meant to be taken literally but to create a strong impression. An example is, "I have a million things to do today," which emphasizes a busy schedule.

Sound Devices

Sound devices are 7th grade literary devices that enhance the musical quality of language. They contribute to mood, tone, and memorability by focusing on how words sound rather than just their meaning. These devices are especially common in poetry and lyrical prose.

Alliteration

Alliteration is the repetition of initial consonant sounds in closely connected words. It creates rhythm and can emphasize particular phrases, such as "Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers."

Onomatopoeia

Onomatopoeia refers to words that imitate natural sounds, enhancing sensory experience. Examples include "buzz," "clang," and "sizzle," which help readers hear the action being described.

Assonance

Assonance is the repetition of vowel sounds in words placed near each other. It produces internal rhyming and musicality, as in "The early bird catches the worm."

Rhyme

Rhyme is the repetition of similar sounds at the end of words, often used in poetry to create structure and pleasing effects. For example, "cat" and "hat" rhyme, enhancing memorability.

Alliteration: repeated beginning consonant sounds

Assonance: repeated vowel sounds

• Rhyme: matching end sounds

Structural Literary Devices

Structural literary devices relate to how a text is organized and presented. These 7th grade literary devices influence the pacing, clarity, and overall impact of a story or poem by shaping its framework.

Foreshadowing

Foreshadowing provides hints or clues about events that will occur later in the story. It builds suspense and prepares readers for upcoming developments, often seen in mystery or adventure genres.

Characterization and Point of View

Characterization and point of view are crucial 7th grade literary devices that shape how a story is told and how readers perceive characters and events. These devices affect narrative perspective and character development.

Direct Characterization

Direct characterization explicitly describes a character's traits, such as "She was kind and generous." This straightforward method helps readers quickly understand character qualities.

Indirect Characterization

Theme and Symbolism
