UNDERSTANDING THE CONCEPT OF GOD BEYOND CHRISTIANITY

THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF CHRISTIANITY AND ITS RELATIONSHIP TO GOD

CHRISTIANITY EMERGED IN THE FIRST CENTURY CE WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF SECOND TEMPLE JUDAISM AND GRECO-ROMAN

ISLAM TEACHES THAT GOD (ALLAH) IS ABSOLUTE, UNIQUE, AND INCOMPARABLE. THE QURAN DENIES ANY DIVISION IN GOD'S NATURE AND CRITICIZES CHRISTIAN DOCTRINES THAT SUGGEST GOD HAS A SON. ISLAM STRESSES SUBMISSION TO THE ONE GOD AS THE PATH TO RIGHTEOUSNESS.

OTHER RELIGIOUS AND PHILOSOPHICAL VIEWS

Many other religions and spiritual philosophies offer interpretations of the divine that differ from Christian teachings. These views contribute to a richer understanding of God beyond the Christian framework, encompassing a wide range of beliefs about the nature and role of the divine.

COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT GOD AND CHRISTIANITY
