EARLY CHURCH AND APOSTOLIC ACTIVITY

FOLLOWING JESUS' RESURRECTION AND ASCENSION, THE EARLY CHRISTIAN CHURCH BEGAN TO FORM, SPREADING THE GOSPEL MESSAGE. THE BOOK OF ACTS PROVIDES A HISTORICAL ACCOUNT OF THE APOSTLES' MISSIONARY JOURNEYS AND THE EXPANSION OF THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY. THIS ERA SPANS ROUGHLY FROM 30 AD TO ABOUT 62 AD AND INCLUDES SIGNIFICANT EVENTS SUCH AS PENTECOST, PAUL'S CONVERSION, AND HIS MISSIONARY TRAVELS.

PERSECUTIONS AND CHURCH GROWTH

During this period, Christians faced varying degrees of persecution from both Jewish authorities and the Roman Empire. The letters of Paul and other apostles were written to address theological issues, encourage believers, and guide the growing church amidst these challenges. This period extends into the late first century, highlighting the gradual institutionalization of Christian doctrine.

DATING THE NEW TESTAMENT BOOKS

Most scholars agree that Mark was the earliest Gospel written, approximately between 65 and 70 AD. These dates are based on internal evidence, references to historical events, and stylistic elements.

PAULINE EPISTLES DATING

THE LETTERS ATTRIBUTED TO PAUL WERE WRITTEN DURING HIS MISSIONARY JOURNEYS, ROUGHLY BETWEEN 50 AND 67 AD.



GENERAL EPISTLES AND REVELATION

OTHER NEW TESTAMENT WRITINGS, INCLUDING THE GENERAL EPISTLES (JAMES, PETER, JOHN, JUDE) AND THE BOOK OF REVELATION, ARE GENERALLY DATED FROM THE LATE FIRST CENTURY TO EARLY SECOND CENTURY. REVELATION IS COMMONLY DATED AROUND 95 AD DURING THE REIGN OF EMPEROR DOMITIAN.

PROPOSED CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER OF NEW TESTAMENT WRITINGS

While the canonical order of the New Testament groups books by type rather than date, scholars have proposed a chronological sequence that reflects the historical timeline of composition. Below is a commonly accepted chronological list of New Testament writings.
