CARRIE

PUBLISHED IN 1974, "CARRIE" WAS STEPHEN KING'S FIRST PUBLISHED NOVEL. IT TELLS THE STORY OF A BULLIED TEENAGE GIRL WITH TELEKINETIC POWERS WHO EXACTS REVENGE ON HER TORMENTORS. THE NOVEL'S EXPLORATION OF ADOLESCENCE, ABUSE, AND SUPERNATURAL REVENGE SET THE TONE FOR MANY OF KING'S LATER WORKS.

THE SHINING

"THE SHINING," RELEASED IN 1977, REMAINS ONE OF THE MOST FAMOUS STEPHEN KING BOOKS. THE STORY CENTERS ON JACK TORRANCE, A WRITER AND RECOVERING ALCOHOLIC WHO BECOMES THE WINTER CARETAKER OF THE ISOLATED OVERLOOK HOTEL. THE NOVEL MASTERFULLY COMBINES PSYCHOLOGICAL HORROR WITH SUPERNATURAL ELEMENTS, CREATING AN ENDURING CHILLING ATMOSPHERE.

IT
