Once you have your textbooks ready and have identified a donation location, you can drop off your items. Most Goodwill locations have designated drop-off areas for donations. If you have a large quantity of textbooks, consider calling ahead to confirm that the location can accept your donation.

#### **OBTAIN A DONATION RECEIPT**

AFTER DROPPING OFF YOUR TEXTBOOKS, BE SURE TO REQUEST A DONATION RECEIPT. THIS RECEIPT WILL SERVE AS PROOF OF YOUR DONATION FOR TAX PURPOSES. KEEP IT IN A SAFE PLACE FOR YOUR RECORDS.

## OTHER DONATION OPTIONS FOR TEXTBOOKS

While donating textbooks to Goodwill is a fantastic option, there are several other organizations and methods available for those looking to donate their used books.

#### LOCAL LIBRARIES

SCHOOLS, PARTICULARLY THOSE SERVING LOW-INCOME COMMUNITIES, OFTEN APPRECIATE DONATIONS OF TEXTBOOKS THAT CAN BE USED IN CLASSROOMS. CONTACT LOCAL SCHOOLS TO INQUIRE ABOUT THEIR NEEDS.

#### ONLINE DONATION PLATFORMS

There are also various online platforms that facilitate textbook donations. Websites like BookMooch or Better World Books allow you to donate books directly to those in need or to organizations that distribute them.

## Q: CAN I DONATE TEXTBOOKS THAT ARE OUTDATED?

A: While some outdated textbooks may still hold value, it is best to check with Goodwill or other organizations to see if they accept them. Generally, more recent editions are preferred.

## Q: IS THERE A LIMIT TO HOW MANY TEXTBOOKS I CAN DONATE AT ONCE?

A: THERE IS TYPICALLY NO LIMIT, BUT IT IS ADVISABLE TO CONTACT YOUR LOCAL GOODWILL LOCATION TO ENSURE THEY CAN ACCOMMODATE LARGE DONATIONS.

## Q: CAN I GET A TAX DEDUCTION FOR DONATING TEXTBOOKS?

A: YES, YOU CAN CLAIM A TAX DEDUCTION FOR THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF THE DONATED TEXTBOOKS, PROVIDED YOU KEEP A RECEIPT FOR YOUR RECORDS.

# Q: WHAT IF I HAVE TEXTBOOKS FROM A SPECIFIC SUBJECT AREA?

A: GOODWILL ACCEPTS TEXTBOOKS FROM VARIOUS SUBJECT AREAS, INCLUDING SCIENCE, LITERATURE, AND MATHEMATICS. HOWEVER, IT'S BEST TO CONFIRM WITH THEM ABOUT SPECIFIC NEEDS.

# Q: How does Goodwill use the proceeds from donated textbooks?

A: PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF DONATED TEXTBOOKS FUND JOB TRAINING PROGRAMS AND COMMUNITY SERVICES AIMED AT HELPING INDIVIDUALS FIND EMPLOYMENT AND IMPROVE THEIR LIVES.

# Q: CAN I DONATE TEXTBOOKS DIRECTLY TO STUDENTS OR SCHOOLS INSTEAD OF GOODWILL?

A: YES, YOU CAN DONATE DIRECTLY TO STUDENTS, SCHOOLS, OR EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS. THIS CAN OFTEN HAVE AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT ON THOSE IN NEED OF RESOURCES.

# Q: ARE THERE ANY SPECIFIC TIMES WHEN GOODWILL ACCEPTS DONATIONS?

A: MOST GOODWILL LOCATIONS ACCEPT DONATIONS DURING THEIR REGULAR BUSINESS HOURS, BUT IT IS ADVISABLE TO CHECK WITH YOUR LOCAL STORE FOR ANY SPECIFIC GUIDELINES OR RESTRICTIONS.

## Q: WHAT HAPPENS TO THE TEXTBOOKS THAT ARE NOT SOLD AT GOODWILL?

A: Textbooks that are not sold may be recycled or distributed to other organizations that can use them. Goodwill aims to ensure that all items have the best chance of being reused or recycled.
