I'm no Rodgers fan; after all, I was born and raised in inner-city Chicago and have been a Bears fan since birth, but I recognize greatness, and Aaron Rodgers is a great football player. Some of his other qualities? Not so much. But these aren't lessons about tackle football. They're insights about leadership; about what happens off the football field, and on a more important playing field; about greatness in sales, marketing, and business; and about thought leadership, the single most important differentiator in the business playbook. Or, as Plato not so recently said, obviously unaware of Aaron Rodgers's famous retreat into darkness, "We can easily forgive a child who is afraid of the dark; the real tragedy of life is when men are afraid of the light." I'd like to shed some light on what's required in business, but frequently misunderstood. What every salesperson needs to know, but doesn't always know how to achieve it.
