In addition, the controversies and discrepancies in the theoretical and

experimental record are key drivers in understanding the development of science as we know it today.

The use of different words occurring immediately after wh words in the two corpora can be explained by (1) the relatively small vocabulary size of the L2 speakers; (2) non-native speakers lack of awareness of restricted collocations; (3) L1 transfer; (4) over/under-generalization of rules and (5) textbooks.
