I drew on an analytical framework adapted from Stein, Grover, and Henningsen (1996) to assess various features of the lesson, in order to note the interaction between the materials and the teachers' decisions about how to use them. I developed a lesson signature for each teacher, a visual representation of the typical organization of the teacher's lessons and how materials were used within them. My findings indicated that the teachers' individual goals for their teaching, beliefs about their students' needs, and interpretations of the district's curricular mandates interacted to steer their instructional choices to very different results. Two of the teachers dutifully followed the textbook, while two essentially disregarded it in favor of other materials. Teachers' own senses of their autonomy to make curricular decisions and their support for their students' autonomy in learning math emerged as important factors.
